Strategies for Involvement

An annual parent meeting will be offered at various days and times in order to accommodate parents. The purpose of the meeting is to:

Expanding Opportunities for Involvement

To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership with Odessa Upper Elementary, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, the school will:

- Provide parents with help on topics such as:
