Reader's Workshop

I am so proud to share how awesome each and everyone of the students is doing in reading!! The use of a variety of reading strategies, fluency, and expression have really blossomed! We recently cleaned out book boxes and I LOVE how they don't want to give up some of their favorite books!! Puts a big smile on my face to see them excited about reading!! We are about to embark on another fun

reading project!! We are going to begin rehearsing for a "Reader's Theatre." This really helps with reading comprehension, fluency and reading with expression.



Math

In math, we will continue to practice and review all we have learned up to this point during morning work and calendar time. During the math lessons, our focus has been counting and number patterns to 120. This includes skip counting by 5's, 10's and ordering numbers no mat-

ter where the starting digit is.

We are currently learning about "Tens and Ones."
We are pretty good at counting and creating tens and ones but now we will be using tens and ones to add/subtract and find all the ways to use tens and ones to make a

number. We will also continue to work on subtraction facts to 20. This is a tough skill and should be practiced at home.

Content

We have covered many things recently during content. From learning about Martin Luther King, Jr., Ground Hog Day, to Presidents. Our new focus is on the symbols of Ameri-

ca. We will be gathering information on the American Flag, Statue of Liberty, Liberty Bell, Washing Monument, and the Bald Eagle. Then students will choose one of those to do

a poster on to share what they learned with others. They are very excited about poster making!!
