

Kiss-N-Go Drop Off and Pick Up <u>Please follow these instructions for everyone's safety.</u>

The area between the McQuerry office sidewalk entrance and north to the driveway exiting on 3rd Street is the designated pick up and drop off zone for students. Do not use this area for parking. Vehicles should enter College Street from 4th Street. Proceed on College and make a left on 3rd Street to pick up your child. Children need to be able to enter the car from curbside unassisted. Cars in Kiss-N-Go should continue down 3rd Street to a side street and not U-turn on 3rd Street to head North.



Breakfast/Lunch Money - Parents are encouraged to buy monthly lunch tickets. The breakfast and lunch prices for September (19 Breakfast days and 17 lunch days) are as follows:

BREAKFAST: \$1.40 LUNCH: \$2.00 EXTRA MILK: \$.40 All Lunch/Milk Money should be sent to school in an envelope marked with child's name, teacher and amount enclosed. Our lunch payment is computerized so lunch cashiers are not able to take cash from students in the lunch line. Thank you for your help.



GOOD THINGS TO LEAVE AT HOME

One of the main goals of Odessa R-VII Elementary Schools is to increase students' time-on-task. We are always looking for better ways to increase students' learning time and instructors' teaching time. <u>Shoe Skates</u> - Students are requested not to wear shoe skates to school. They have the potential to cause injury.


Cell Phones/Pagers/Electronic Devices

PARENTS RIGHT TO KNOW

Our district is required to inform you of certain information that you, according to The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (Public Law 107-110), have the right to know. Upon request, our district is required to provide to you in a timely manner, the following information:

- *Whether the teacher has met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and Subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- *Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- *Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.
- *What baccalaureate degree major the teacher has and any other graduate certification or Degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification.

In addition to the information that parents may request, districts must provide to each individual parent:

*Information on the achievement level of the parent's child in each of the state academic

Assessments as required under this part; and

*Timely notice that the parent's child has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more Consecutive weeks by, a teacher who is not highly qualified
