We are cleaning out our book boxes to take out some of the easier books and make room for some new "just right" books. Our focus continues to be on reading comprehension and fluency. When your student is reading, it should sound like they are telling a story. They need

read using the punctuation, expression, and appropriate voice tones. When your student is done reading, ask them lots of questions to see if they are able to retell you important events, share a lesson learned, or even ask them questions that allow them to make personal connec-

tions to the text.

Tip: Its great for your students to see and hear you reading, too. When they see the adults reading, it shows them how important reading is.

I will begin giving mid-year assess-ments at the end of November.

writing through the steps of the writing process making sure their story has a good beginning, sharing at least three details, and a


catchy ending. They are also checking to see if it is legible, has spaces, punctuation, and capital letters. I am so proud their hard work!!
