March is Autoimmune Awareness month.

It has been documented that approximately 4 in 1 million children each year could develop this rare disease. This disease affects the blood vessels, muscles and skin. In an autoimmune disease the immune system reacts in a different way and becomes overactive in normal/healthy tissue. This type of immune system reaction leads to inflammation, which causes tissues to swell and can lead to tissue damage. Juvenile Dermatomyositis also causes a skin rash and will cause muscle weakness and joint pain.
